### Juxtaposition: Technology and its Impact on Human Sustainability

When was the last time we fed our children by showing and describing the beauty of the stars and the sky? When was the last time you felt the warmth of love from the tightly held palms of your elderly parents during a stroll around the park and along the sandy beach? When was the last time you sneaked out of your virtual world to visit the real, remote world called your hometown?

These open-ended questions suddenly arise in everyone's mind as we are immersed in technology, and they create ripples in our consciousness with the stone of thought that technology is an exploitation of human well-being. Though it may appear monotonous, simply contemplating about them provide immense satisfaction rather than evading or sincerely attempting to answer them. The agenda of our daily lives may look as if we orchestrated it, but it is not—the entities in the revolving earth revolutionize the way we perceive and feel things.

On the one hand, 21<sup>st</sup> century businesses gain attention and reputation by incorporating novel technology into their business models. Some of the most exciting technologies include Necrorobotics - the transformation of dead things into robots; Sand batteries - the transformation of sand into a massive battery; Intelligent Exoskeletons - a mobile medical exoskeleton designed specifically for children; AI image generation - the creation of images from worded prompts; 3D Printed bones—and the list goes on indefinitely. Human dependence on technology, on the other hand, has invariably reached greater heights by losing the core values of the very nature of human creation.

The point to ponder here is: "creating sustainable humanity amidst sustainable technologies." The four pillars of sustainability are economic, human, social, and environmental. Of these four, the crucial element of human sustainability, i.e., the development of skills is highly challenged among the younger generations. Among the students, AI technology stands by their side to complete their projects and assignments by lessening their efforts. Though technology creates avenues for new learning, it prevents humans from upskilling due to the ample resources in the digital world.

The overutilization of technology in every field has raised the global platform for India by compromising on the basic human elements of love, emotions, sharing, etc. More worryingly, technology is able to tilt the ecosystem and thus serves as an alarming signal among the fraternity to delve into it before the purpose of human creation is transitioned from the noble values of India. Tangible assets or growth cannot be tantamount with intangible assets such as human qualities.

To conclude, technology is required to upgrade the system without abandoning the existing good practices that are inclined towards human sustainability. Deriving caution from these adversaries of technologies and foreseeing the well-being of future generations, Government agencies can draft policy for embracing technology for all constructive purposes and without humanity getting deviated from its core humaneness.



## RECENT HAPPENINGS IN THE INDUSTRY

Bharat Biotech's intranasal Covid vaccine has been approved with the aid of the Union fitness Ministry for inclusion in the vaccination programme as a booster dose for the ones above 18 years of age. The needle-less vaccine is available at centres and added on the Co-WIN platform. This nasal vaccine BBV154 has been in use since November, 2022 for restrained use in an emergency situation for those above 18 as a heterologous booster dose. Consistent with Bharat Biotech, the intranasal vaccine has numerous benefits because the nasal direction has remarkable capacity for vaccination due to the prepared immune structures of the nasal mucosa. It is also non-invasive and needle-less and has ease of management since it does not require educated healthcare workers.

## OUR STUDENTS AS GRADUATES

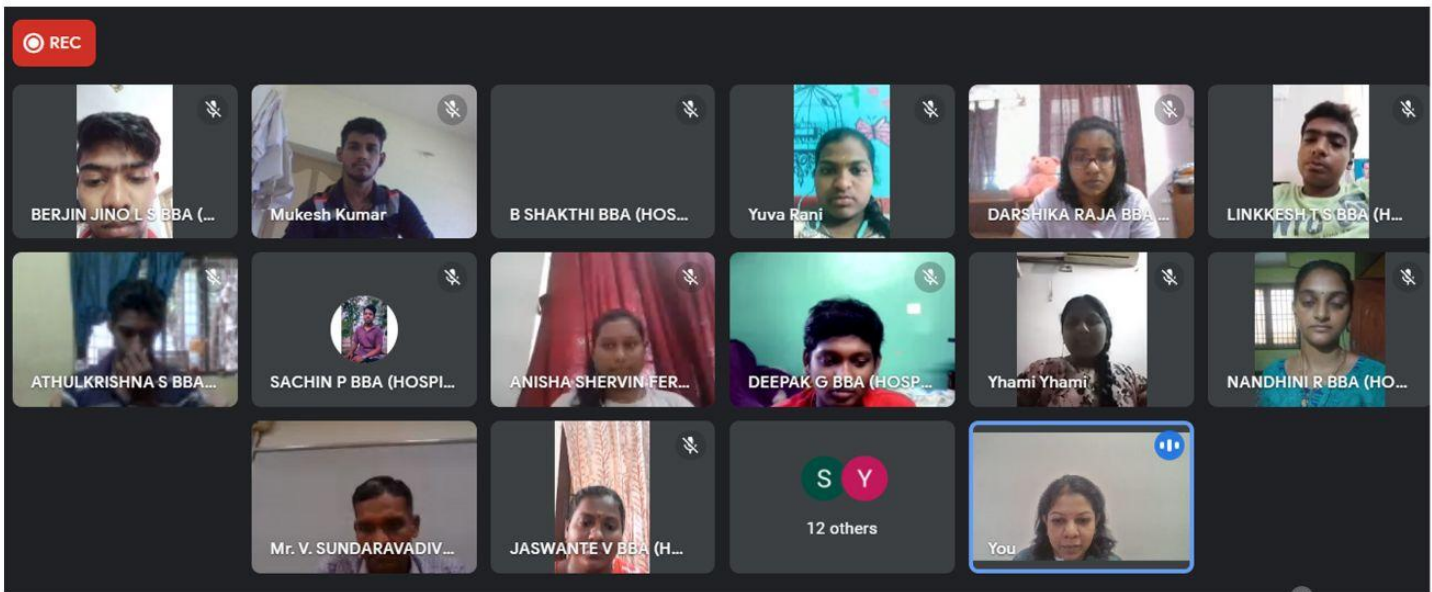

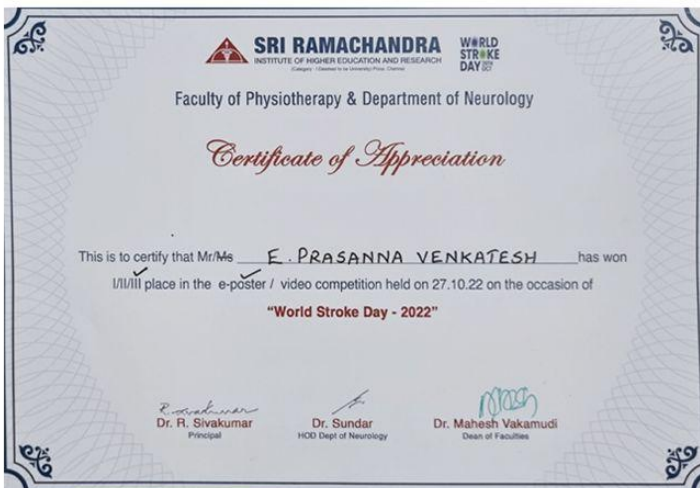
## INSTITUTIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

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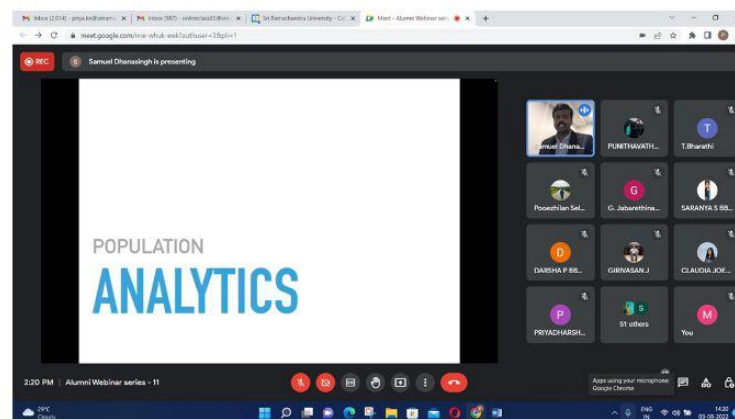


## ALUMNI TALK

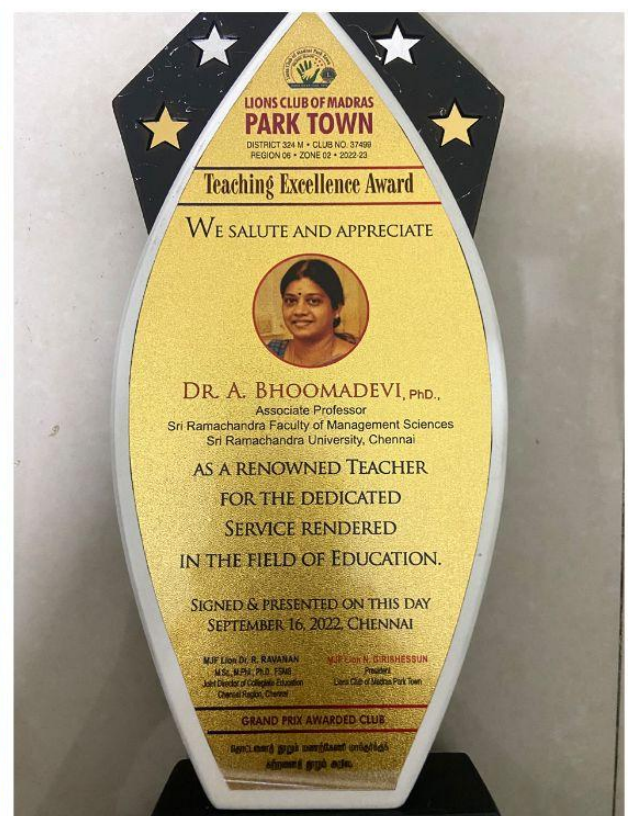


## FACULTY MEMBER ACHIEVEMENTS

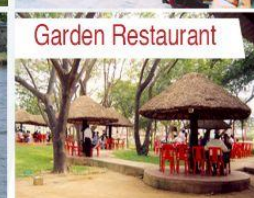
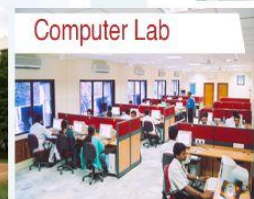
