ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

B.Com (Hons)

Candidates seeking admission to 4-Year B.Com (Hons) Program shall be required to have passed the Higher secondary Course(HSc)/CBSE/ICSE examination or equivalent with an aggregate of 55% marks in the Commerce/Accounting stream or 60% in any other stream with Mathematics or Business Mathematics or Statistics in HSc/CBSE/ICSE or equivalent.

Shortlisting shall be done on the basis of merit ranking comprising candidates' percentage of marks attained in the H.Sc/CBSE/ICSE or equivalent.

B.Com (Hons)-Twinning

Candidates seeking admission to 4-Year B.Com (Hons) Program shall be required to have passed the Higher secondary Course(HSc)/CBSE/ICSE examination or equivalent with an aggregate of 55% marks in the Commerce/Accounting stream or 60% in any other stream with Mathematics or Business Mathematics or Statistics in HSc/CBSE/ICSE or equivalent.

Shortlisting shall be done on the basis of merit ranking comprising candidates' percentage of marks attained in the H.Sc/CBSE/ICSE or equivalent.

Entry to 7th Semester

There will be no specific additional requirements for admission such as Entrance Examination/TOEFL/Screening or such other tests for **SRIHER** students to pursue the 7th and 8th Semester of B.Com. (Honours) Program at **Bentley**. **Bentley** shall rely on **SRIHER's** expertise to admit students into the said Twinning Program.

Bentley University shall admit all the eligible students declared by **SRIHER** for the Final Year entry (7th and 8th Semester) into the B.Com. (Honours) Program at Bentley University.
